

Supreme Court during the operation of the Supreme Court (from 15 December 2017 to 25 September 2025)

the Administrative Cassation Court has rendered 95,919 judgments



the Civil Cassation Court has rendered 92,045 judgments



the Grand Chamber has rendered 6,619 judgments

In total, the Supreme Court has rendered approximately 262,357 judgments

Overall, the Supreme Court has rendered 1,512,245 decisions



the Commercial Cassation Court has rendered 39,664 judgments






